Habit	Ways to Show the Habit
Habit #1: Be Proactive	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Being in charge of myself and my actions (A+ Attitude) • Doing what is right without being asked • Raising my hand to speak, instead of blurting • Not interrupting my teacher during reading workshop and trying to solve my problem myself • Use the THINK strategy: (True, Helpful, Inspiring, Necessary, Kind)
Habit #2: Begin With the End in Mind	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working on reaching the goals I set in _____ (math, reading, writing, PWIM) • Work on my homework every night so that I can turn it in on time and play a game with a friend on Thursday
Habit #3: Put First Things First	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do my homework before I play with friends • Do my reading journal before choice time • Do my leader job and all of its requirements to the best of my ability
Habit #4: Think Win-Win	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Helping my friends find a win-win solution when they have a problem • Listen when my teacher is speaking-I win because I learn, my teacher wins because she/he can teach the class
Habit #5: Seek First To Understand	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Listening to my friends and teachers before I talk • Not getting frustrated when I receive an assignment • Using "I" statements • Saying only things that are true and respectful about other students
Habit #6: Synergize	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working with friends to reach a common goal • Talking to all group members/partners respectfully
Habit #7: Sharpen the Saw	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Balancing my choices in _____ (reading workshop choice time, picking good fit books, recess (who I play with, activity), partners during math workshop, or who I sit by at the carpet.)

Subject	Possible Goals
Math	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Never give up and keep trying even when a problem is difficult (perseverance) • Check my work every time I complete a problem • Try more than one strategy for each problem • Write, in words, to explain how I solved the problem • Work on my facts when I finish before my friends • Ask myself all of the problem solving questions every time I work on a problem • Participate in discussion (contribute an idea, listen to the speakers, use an idea from discussion in my own work)
Writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Put a capital at the beginning of every sentence • Put a period, question mark, or exclamation point at the end of all my sentences • Use my BEST handwriting I possibly can on EVERYTHING I write • Write topic sentence, details, and closing sentence when I write a paragraph • Stay on topic when writing • Include only important details in my writing • Include MORE juicy details in my writing
Reading Workshop	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Complete my reading response journal each day • Do quality work in my reading response journal • Stay in one spot when doing my reading journal and after selecting a choice time activity • Keep my eyes on my book/activity and not talk to friends • Stay focused in small group reading with my teacher
