

Directions for Use

Thank you for downloading this product! It is a fun and straightforward way to teach younger students the skills for time management and prioritizing activities. With this activity, students will learn the importance of getting their work done first before playing.

The two separate sheets allow for quick differentiation. Use the sheet with squares for younger students or those who have not mastered writing to draw a picture for their activities. The sheet with the lines is for older or more advanced students to write in their activities for their list.

When leading this activity, I make sure to point out to students that the boxes beside the lines are for them to check off once they have completed the task. I challenge them to go home that day and work on completing their list without having to be asked by a parent to do so. Then, I tell them to show their parent the list and what they've already checked off before they ask if they can play. I always make a big deal about how surprised and proud their parents are likely to be if they can accomplish their to-do list without even being asked!
